The rooms of Narcotics Anonymous and the people inside them were the power greater than myself that I needed

For the last several years before finding my home in the fellowship of narcotics anonymous, pain, insanity, and self centered behavior were the only constants in my life. A lifestyle built around the getting and using and finding ways and means to use more had led to ingrained patterns of isolation while at the same time believing that the world should bend to my wants and needs. Life was dark, and the need to control my surroundings by manipulating and using whomever and whatever I needed left me broken inside.

Upon finding the rooms of narcotics anonymous though, I was relieved to meet people who shared stories of pasts similar to mine, but who were living new healthy - incredible lives! The freedom found from realizing that I had a disease, and that while it was incurable it could be halted, and the evidence of this in people I was coming to love in these rooms, meant I wasn't simply morally deficient. Through my interactions in meetings and with members of the fellowship, as well as an admission that I was indeed powerless over my addiction and my life had became unmanageable, a bond began to form that allowed me to trust in other people in a way that I hadn't for years (and maybe hadn't ever before). It started a process inside me, that would continue to progress, of restoring me to a place in the universe that I was always intended to inhabit. A place of love and happiness that can only come from shared experiences of coming out of a very dark place and into a new way of life.

This was my first experience with step 2. The rooms of Narcotics Anonymous and the people inside them were the power greater than myself that I needed. On a bad day, I went to a meeting to see my friends. On a good day, I went to a meeting to see my friends. There wasn't a comprehension at first of why I felt better when I went to a meeting outside of the fact that I knew that these people understood me. But that's all I needed. And thank god there wasn't a test involved in becoming a part of this thing or some sort of membership fee I had to pay, because I had no tolerance for tests and no way to pay for what was being given. It was one of the few places I could go to and always feel at home, and it was still a few more years before the world outside of these rooms would welcome me back for the most part. But the ability to speak with you guys about how I was feeling helped restore some social skills that had long been forgotten. And watching you guys get jobs and finish school and go to the doctor regularly and manage healthy relationships helped me on my way to do the same. The process is not quick, and it is certainly not easy, and this is why steps 1-3 should be worked every day in my opinion. But without finding the group, which was my higher power for so long, the task of even beginning to find a healthy normal life (beyond my wildest dreams at the end of the day) seemed to daunting to even begin.

Today I am blessed to have been around these rooms for some time and gain some formal working knowledge of the steps and traditions through our literature, but the action work of step 2 really still sits in the fundamentals and safety the group provided me for so long. So if you are new, know that becoming a greater version of yourself than you could ever imagine is possible, and the people in these rooms can help get you there. And if you are not new, remember to hug and encourage a new comer so that they know we are here for them, because that's what we do.

Because the groups have created the service structure, they have final authority over all its affairs. By the same token, the groups also have the final responsibility for the support of all its activities. The two go hand in hand.


