

In active addiction, we turned our will over to our disease every day. In recovery we learn to surrender to the process, to the program, and ultimately to a power greater than ourselves. When we give up the battle we place ourselves entirely in the care of a power greater than ourselves. It follows naturally that we commit ourselves to the service of that power, however we understand

Step & Tradition of the Month

Step 3: "We made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him."

The implied decision of Step 3 is to continue with the program to the best of our ability. This includes working the 12 Steps with a sponsor, going to meetings regularly, striving to improve our characters, making amends to those we've harmed, and helping others. Willingness is the key principle of Step 3, and the decision is a commitment to our ongoing recovery. If I believe that the God of my understanding has guided me to this point in my journey, then I can trust that my continued efforts will result in greater benefits and growth. These efforts are not only directed to enhance my chances of continued recovery but also help me follow my conscience in all areas of my life. Practicing Step 3 is



about trying to do the next right thing in all circumstances. For me, it can be as easy as picking up trash that I notice, or it can be more involved such as volunteering my time and energy to worthwhile causes. In practicing Step 3, I strive towards making choices that feel right to me and result in my feeling good about being a productive, responsible member of society. The more willing I am to work on Step 3, the more I realize this involves turning my will and life over to the God of my understanding. A short, powerful Third Step request I was taught to help me on this journey is: *God, take my will and my life, guide me in my recovery, and show me how to live*.

Tradition 3: "The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop using."



The only requirement for membership in the 12-step program is a desire to stop using. This requirement is unconditional, as explained in the Third Tradition, without any catches. You do not have to admit you are an addict nor believe in Higher Power. Identity and membership are the principles of the Third Tradition; you are a member when you say you are, period. You do not have to have a sponsor, do the 12 Steps, or follow the many other suggestions. Having a desire to stop using begins our membership, and these other practices can strengthen efforts to be successful. Even if unsuccessful, members are strongly encouraged to keep coming back and keep trying. Many of us tried

and failed several times before recovery really began to stick. Open-mindedness, willingness, faith, and courage in our ability to love and carry the message to everyone is the basis of the Third Tradition.

Surrender

- 1. Personal recovery begins with surrender to the First Step (Guiding Principles, Tradition 1).
- 2. Surrender to the First Tradition brings us to understand that we are part of something much greater than ourselves (Guiding Principles, Tradition 1).
- 3. Finding the patience and tolerance to accept those members we can't seem to stop judging is an exercise in surrender, acceptance, and humility (Guiding Principles, Tradition 3).
- 4. Surrender means having the open-mindedness to see things in a new way, as well as the willingness to live differently (Living Clean, "Awakening to Our Spirituality").
- 5. In ridding ourselves of all reservations, we surrender. Then, and only then, can we be helped to recover from the disease of addiction (IP #29).
- 6. Surrender...is what happens after we've accepted the First Step as something that is true for us and have accepted that recovery is the solution (Step Working Guides, Step 1).
- 7. We are powerless over our addiction, but in our surrender we become powerful tools for transformation (Living Clean, "A Spiritual Path").
- 8. When nothing relieved our paranoia and fear, we hit bottom and became ready to ask for help (Basic Text, "Why are we here?").
- 9. Only in working the First Step do we truly come to realize that we are addicts, that we have hit bottom, and that we must surrender (Step Working Guides, Step 1).
- 10. In the Seventh Step, we take our surrender to a deeper level. What began in Step One with an acknowledgment of our addiction now includes an acknowledgment of the shortcomings that go along with our addiction (Step Working Guides, Step 7).
- 11. Striving to maintain and build on our surrender, we are better able to live and enjoy life in the moment (It Works, Step 3).
- Surrender begins as we become willing to consider new ideas. We can ask for help and accept it when it's offered (IP #17).
- 13. How do you know when it's time to speak up against a decision of the majority? When it's time to accept a decision and surrender to group conscience? (Twelve Concepts for NA Service, "9th Concept Study and Discussion Questions").
- 14. Admitting our powerlessness is a surrender, an admission that we don't know the solution to our problems (IP #17).

A New Way to Find a Meeting!






