Carrying Our Message: Recap of the NA Booth at the Montgomery County Fair

The Montgomery Area PR Subcommittee hosted an NA booth at the Montgomery County Fair this summer for **9 days!** This was by far the largest NA endeavor our Area OR our Region has ever attempted. The 2nd largest PR event was done in 2001 at a 2-day NA booth at the HFStival, an Alternative Rock Concert.

As with all NA booths, we had a variety of "clients." We handed out NA cards, meeting lists, NA flyers, and literature to adults and teenagers. We had potential members ask us for information as well as non-addicts such as counselors, concerned parents and friends, teachers, an EMT, police, clergy, and one irate neighbor! A 10 year-old came up, and with downcast eyes, asked for some literature for his older brother. I told him he was a great brother to care so much!

Our stats: We filled 81 shifts (nine days, three 4-hour shifts a day, three members per shift), with 53 volunteers (35 were new to PR!), from 6 Areas. Our volunteers ranged from 2 months clean to 40+ years. It was wonderful to have such a variety of members come out to play to carry the message - THANK YOU!!!

Since the fair, we have had several of those new members help out with our booths at the Seneca Valley HS Back-to-School Night and the Montgomery County Overdose Awareness events. Inspired by our work, South Potomac and Central MD Areas have combined efforts to host an NA booth at the Prince George's County Fair, September 4th-7th.

To top things off, at the fair, NA won the ribbon for the **Best Non-Profit Exhibit!** One man said we had a fantastic booth
because we "Came early, stayed late, and always had
members ready to help". I thought, "Of course...that's just
what we have been taught to do!"

The purpose behind this and all PR work is to carry the message of NA Recovery so that members can find us and lives can be saved. I truly believe we met that goal. I don't know how long it may take, but one day, I am hoping to hear, "I was at this fair, and someone gave me this card. I decided to call NA and get some help!" ~ Anne E.



Step of the Month

In *It Works: How and Why*, promotion is described as "fanfare, overblown claims, [and] celebrity endorsements."


In PR service, all we are charged with doing is informing the public that we are a credible program of recovery. We must be visible in order to be attractive.




