Montgomery Area Inventory Results!

The MANA Inventory was opened for group input in January, and seven groups submitted responses. Overall, our Area scored very well in its **use of human and financial resources to carry NA's message effectively** (91%). We also rated highly in our **demonstration of responsibility and accountability** (89%). However, the results showed a significant concern in our **ability to train and support members who serve on the Area Service Committee**, where we scored notably lower (31%). The Inventory also gave groups a chance to share any extra thoughts. Here's what they said:

Many groups do not bring issues/needs of their group to Area.

One area that could use improvement would be when motions are to be taken back to the groups. It would be helpful if the wording were made clear before going back to the groups.

Representation at Region has been sporadic this year.

Current committee members should be proactive in identifying and directly recruiting volunteers to fill vacant positions.

Duration of Area meetings [is too long]. 2 pros 2 cons move on.

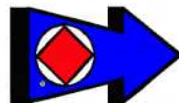

I have done several Fourth Step inventories since, and each one seems to reveal more about myself than I ever knew prior.
